a Letter from the Honble Edward
Cornwallis Esq. His Majesty's Governour
of Nova Scotia dated the 17th of October
last, acquainting us amongst other Things
with the Hostilities committed by the Micmac
Indians headed by one De Lentre a French
Priest, and enclosing the Declaration of
War, with the Resolution of His Majesty's
Council thereupon, and the Proclamation
published by Him, We take Leave to
inclose to your Grace a Copy of the
said Letter and Papers, together with
Copies of a Letter from him to Mons^r
Decherbier, Governour of Louisiana and
his Answer thereto, relative to the
Depredations committed by the said
Indians; We also inclose to your
Grace a Copy of an Abstract of the
Account
